Information Regarding Churches – COVID-19: Masks and Distanced Gatherings

Recently the Chief Medical Officer of Health issued a *Special Measures Order (Masks)* and the Province published *COVID-19 Guidance for Distanced Gatherings*. The regulations and changes presented in these documents come into effect on Monday August 24, 2020 and may have an effect on some of the policies and procedures presently in place for our worship services and our parish and diocesan offices and facilities.

Special Measures Order (Masks) mandates that masks that cover the nose and mouth must be worn in public indoor settings including: a place of worship. Among those who are exempted from this requirement are: children under the age of 5; people with physical or mental health conditions; and people seated in a place where activities or services of a religious nature are offered provided physical distancing of two metres can be achieved between individuals or bubbles and provided they wear a mask when moving around.

COVID-19 Guidance for Distanced Gatherings increases from 50 to 100 people the maximum number of people allowed at faith gatherings, weddings and funerals in facilities large enough to allow for the required physical distancing.

For Places of Worship the above changes mean:

- Masks will need to be worn by everyone entering and moving around in our churches, although while in "physically distanced seating" masks may be removed (this also applies to the celebrant at the altar, the reader at the ambo and the cantor at the podium).
- Churches large enough to allow for the required social distancing may have up to a maximum of 100 people present for worship services.

Doors will open 30 minutes before mass time. Upon arrival parishioners will confirm their preregistration with the greeter and will be asked to read and confirm compliance with the COVID-19 Self Assessment Screening Questionnaire, which will be displayed at the entrance to the church. Parishioners are reminded that if they are feeling ill, they should not attend public worship.

Parishioners are asked to respect and follow the direction of volunteer greeters and ushers while in the church. These volunteers will be assisting with seating, communion and exiting. This will ensure adherence to required guidelines.

There will be no offertory collection. A collection box will be available at the entrance for your weekly financial contributions. You may also continue to provide your donation using the drop box at the parish office.

Each church will have a different capacity based on size and layout. Pre-registration to attend mass will be required. To register to attend mass you are asked to contact **weekly** the designated volunteer for your church between **10:00** am and **2:00** pm on Wednesday. Please respect this process and only call at the indicated times.

For contact tracing purposes, records must be kept for two weeks of all people entering our churches.
