This will enable the important observance to take place in compliance with Public Health Guidelines during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Individuals, families, or others wishing to place a wreath at the cenotaph in memory of a fallen comrade are invited and encouraged to do so privately following the 11:00 am ceremony. Following the ceremony, a Memorial Cross will be set up at the Cenotaph site. This will allow for the ritual where members of the public are invited to place their Poppies on the Memorial Cross in tribute to the fallen. Information regarding Churches - COVID-19

- Masks will need to be worn by everyone entering and moving around in our churches, although while in “physically distanced seating” masks may be removed (this also applies to the celebrant at the altar, the reader at the ambo and the cantor at the podium).

Doors will open 30 minutes before mass time. Upon arrival parishioners will confirm their pre-registration with the greeter and will be asked to read and confirm compliance with the COVID-19 Self Assessment Screening Questionnaire, which will be displayed at the entrance to the church. Parishioners are reminded that if they are feeling ill, they should not attend public worship.

Parishioners are asked to respect and follow the direction of volunteer greeters and ushers while in the church. These volunteers will be assisting with seating, communion and exiting. This will ensure adherence to required guidelines.

Each church will have a different capacity based on size and layout. Pre-registration to attend mass will be required. To register to attend mass you are asked to contact **weekly** the designated volunteer for your church between **10:00 am and 2:00 pm on Wednesday**. Please respect this process and only call at the indicated times. ***When you register, please identify if you are in a bubble with someone to help maximize seating capacity.***

Special Archdiocesan All Soul’s Day Mass

Monday November 2nd at 7:00 p.m.

Since March 2020, four people have died of COVID-19 in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador. As well, during that time period there have been many other deaths from other causes in our province. The restrictions and regulations put in place to prevent the further spread of the coronavirus pandemic has affected how the friends and loved ones of all these deceased were able to celebrate their funerals and mourn their loss.

In the Catholic Church, All Souls Day, November 2nd, is a day especially dedicated to the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. It is a day both for remembering those whom we love who have died and for praying for the repose of their souls.

This year on Monday November 2nd at 7:00 p.m. a special Mass will be celebrated in the Basilica-Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. It will be offered for the repose of the souls of all those who have died in this province since the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic and for the consolation and healing of all those who are struggling with the pain and grief of the death of loved ones.
