Information regarding Churches - COVID-19

The Archdiocesan COVID-19 Sub-Committee makes the following recommendations:

- Face Masks must be worn by congregants throughout (except when receiving Communion, and lectors, cantors, and the celebrant when ministering.
- The need to observe social distancing and enhanced sanitation protocols must be maintained.
- Contact tracing Registration

Doors will open 30 minutes before mass time. Upon arrival parishioners will confirm their pre-registration with the greeter and will be asked to read and confirm compliance with the COVID-19 Self Assessment Screening Questionnaire, which will be displayed at the entrance to the church. Parishioners are reminded that if they are feeling ill, they should not attend public worship.

Parishioners are asked to respect and follow the direction of volunteer greeters and ushers while in the church. These volunteers will be assisting with seating, communion and exiting. This will ensure adherence to required guidelines.

THE XVI SYNOD OF BISHOPS HAS BEGUN IN OUR ARCHDIOCESE

On October 10th, 2021, in Rome, Pope Francis opened the two-year synodal journey of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops with a time for encounter and reflection. The theme of the Synod is for a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission. Archbishop Peter Hundt will officially open the synod in the Archdiocese of St. John's this Sunday, October 17 with a special 11:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral-Basilica of St. John the Baptist which will be livestreamed on www.thebasilica.net.

In the coming weeks, the Archdiocese will be inviting responses to an online survey, and also inviting people to participate through various focus groups. The results of the survey and the focus groups will be collated and combined with the results of similar consultations in dioceses across Canada. This combined consultation report will be sent to Rome as a part of the Canadian Church's participation in this first phase of the synod.
